

Susie, when was your first desire to become involved in the music & who were your first idols? When I was seven years old my parents gave me a cassette player as birthday preser and I started recording all the songs I heard on the radio. My favorite music was

already Swing. I had a lot of Idols, starting with Dean Martin, Frank Sinatra, Elvis Presley, Albert Hammond, Stevie Wonder, Don Henley, John, George, Paul, Ringo or Roger Whittaker as well. By the way, I was totally in love with all of them...


